## Featured Speaker: Lundy Bancroft

BISC-MI is pleased to feature Lundy Bancroft as the primary speaker for this year's conference. The conference also includes thought-provoking and informative presentations from several researchers and practitioners in the field of domestic violence intervention.

Lundy Bancroft offers trainings on identifying abusive men, understanding the dynamics of their attitudes and behavior, supporting safety and recovery for abused women and their children, and fostering change in abusers.

Lundy Bancroft has 14 years of experience working with batterers as a counselor and clinical supervisor, with involvement in over 2000 cases. He has also served extensively as a custody evaluator (Guardian ad Litem) and child abuse investigator, appears periodically as an expert witness in child custody and child welfare cases, and has led groups for teenage boys exposed to domestic violence. He has been training judges, probation officers, and other court personnel on men who batter and their effects on children for eight years, and has been a frequent presenter for child protective personnel, therapists, law enforcement, and medical providers.

Books authored and co-authored by Lundy Bancroft are **The Batterer as Parent: Addressing the Impact of Domestic Violence on Family Dynamics** and **Why Does He Do That?: Inside the Minds of Angry and Controlling Men**. He has coauthored articles in the *New England Journal of Medicine* and the *Journal of Contemporary Psychology*, is coauthor of two nationally marketed curricula, one for working with batterers and one for teen dating violence education in schools.

Lundy is currently part of a human rights research project that is documenting and publicizing the institutional mistreatment of abused women and their children through custody and visitation litigation after they have left the abuser. He has created a website, [www.lundybancroft.com](http://www.lundybancroft.com) to offer support and resources to abused women and their children.
