14:43:03 From Diana Groener : All sexual behavior is intentional by definition. Even if drunk/high etc, you are choosing to move your body in particular ways. You didn't trip and fall naked on top of another naked person. You chose actions.

14:43:34 From Diana Groener : Drugs and alcohol make it hard to make healthy choices, but they don't excuse it.

14:43:42 From D Magnan : Indeed

14:43:57 From Emily Murphy : i don't think cheating is abusive, because of body autonomy. I work with teens who will equate cheating with sexual and physical abuse and we talk about body autonomy and that idea of "owning" someone else

14:44:50 From Diana Groener : Interesting Emily Murphy. I do think there is a difference between 'abusive' and 'hurtful'.

14:45:15 From Chris Huffine : Cheating refers to a violation of a sexual agreement, which, inherently, is abusive. It's not about "owning" someone, it's about agreeing to monogamy.

14:45:45 From Diana Groener : Yes, cheating is a violation of the sexual agreements made.

14:45:57 From Emily Murphy : I am glad rape is against the law. Please, don't make cheating against the law!

14:46:13 From Chris Huffine : Most sexualized violence is not against the law.

14:46:21 From Diana Groener : There are still exceptions to marital rape in several states, too.

14:46:55 From Richard Roberts : This is an interesting conversation to me. I think of cheating as controlling behavior--on the scale with codependency, in that one is using other people to manage emotions. But this is giving me a lot of good ways of thinking about it!

14:47:04 From Diana Groener : And sexual violence within relationships is rarely prosecuted. If these behaviors were done between strangers it's seen as 'wrong' more easily by society.

14:47:17 From Eileen McKeever : Timo Neisho - Sex with a consent, is only sex. There is no such thing as "consensual sex" or "non-consensual sex", that is rape. There is sex or rape. Rape is not a type of sex. You wouldn't say "breating swimming" or "non-breathing swimming". You would say swimming or drowning.

14:48:48 From D Magnan : Absolutely Diana. In several states certain forms of rape (eg drugging) would be illegal if it were done by strangers, but are totally legal and not prosecutable when done by a spouse
